He remains involved in clinical research and in the development of a pioneering implantable monitor. He has been involved in development of key clinical guidelines. More recently he has established Northern Ireland's first conduction system pacing service and continues to deliver education and proctorship for those keen to develop their skills in this area.









## Mairead McClintock Diabetes Specialist Nurse

I have been a qualified nurse for 35 years and have been a Diabetes specialist nurse for the past 22 years in the South West Acute Hospital in Enniskillen, part of the Western Trust.

I work in the acute hospital setting providing diabetes care and advice to in-patients with diabetes and to staff who care for them. I work as part of a team providing diabetes specialist clinics in the out-patient setting. I have a particular interest in insulin pumps, diabetes & pregnancy and the new technologies for managing diabetes. I am a DAFNE trained educator and deliver the DAFNE programme in out-reach facilities in our location.

I was selected as Diabetes UK Clinical Champion in 2018-2020, my project focused on improving Diabetes in-patient care and increasing knowledge and education for staff caring for those living with Diabetes.



## **Emma McCracken**Consultant Diabetes and Endocrinology

Dr McCracken is a consultant Endocrinologist and Diabetologist based in the South West Acute Hospital in Enniskillen. She graduated from Queen's University Belfast in 2007 and subsequently began her Foundation Training in North Tees and Hartlepool NHS Trust. She returned to her native Northern Ireland for Core and Specialty Training. She took up her current consultant post in September 2016 and has been developing transition and diabetes maternity services within the hospital. She is now leading the reset of local Diabetes and Endocrinology Services in the aftermath of the COVID pandemic.



Laura McGowan
Psychologist and Senior Lecturer in Nutrition and Behaviour Change

Dr Laura McGowan is a Chartered Psychologist and Senior Lecturer in Nutrition and Behaviour Change within the Centre for Public Health, Queen's University Belfast, previously working at the Public Health Agency NI and the Health Behaviour Research Centre, University College London. Dr McGowan's programme of research focuses on the development of behavioural interventions for health-promoting behaviours, set against a backdrop of obesity and nutritional challenges in the population. Her research involves varied methods relating to obesity, including prevention, management and weight stigma. Patient and public involvement represents a significant element of her research cycle, working closely with individuals with lived experience of obesity. Dr McGowan is Past Chair of the Division of Health Psychology, NI and led the Association for the Study of Obesity (ASO) Northern Ireland Network from 2015-2025; she now holds a strategic role with ASO delivering the UK Congress on Obesity annually.









## Leanne Stratton Consultant Hepatologist

I graduated from Queen's University Belfast in 2010 and completed medical and gastroenterology training in Northern Ireland, alongside a year in the Scottish Liver Transplant Unit in the Royal Infirmary of Edinburgh. I took up my consultant hepatologist post in October 2019.

I am lead for paediatric transition to adult hepatology services, and have been clinical lead of the Regional Liver Unit since January 2023. Alongside my passion for liver transplant, I have developed a keen interest in service development and quality improvement. From this, I have helped to support the development of a nurse-led fatty liver service within the Belfast Trust. I have also led work which led to the close link of the Belfast Trust and the Northern Ireland Blood Transfusion Service (NIBTS) to improve the care of patients with haemochromatosis while also increasing blood donation to NIBTS.

## Laura Cox Advanced Practice Clinical Pharmacist in Cardiology and Medicine, South West Acute Hospital

Laura graduated from Queen's University Belfast in 2003 and completed her pre-registration year at Great Ormond Street Hospital. She began her career as a Pharmacist at the Royal Victoria Hospital, providing clinical pharmacy services across multiple specialties, with a particular focus on Cardiology. She later introduced a dedicated clinical pharmacy service within the Endocrine & Diabetes department, supporting patients from admission through to discharge.

While completing an MSc with BHSCT, Laura established a home healthcare service delivering immunomodulators to high-risk patients across Northern Ireland. She also undertook a secondment with the Regional Pharmaceutical Procurement team, leading regional tendering and cost-efficiency initiatives that delivered substantial savings and earned her a nomination for Hospital Pharmacist of the Year.

Currently, Laura is an Advanced Practice Clinical Pharmacist in Cardiology and Medicine at the South West Acute Hospital. With over 20 years of NHS experience, she has developed extensive expertise in managing patients with complex multi-morbidities. She contributes across cardiology inpatient services, cardiac rehabilitation, and heart failure management. In the past year, she has shared in her teams' successes, winning both the Innovation Award at the QI & Innovation Showcase for a shared care model in coronary artery disease, and NI Cardiology Team of the Year 2025.

Alongside clinical practice, Laura is deeply committed to education. She has taught undergraduate and postgraduate medical, nursing, and pharmacy students, receiving recognition as NI Hospital Pharmacist Tutor of the Year. She also tutors and assesses independent prescribing pharmacists with NICPLD across Northern Ireland.

She has recently completed a Practitioner with Specialist Interest Diploma in Cardiology at the University of Bradford, with the aim of translating this training into meaningful healthcare service innovation.
