Kashif has an interest in Diabetes and Obesity and holds SCOPE (Strategic Centre for Obesity Professional Education) certification.



Samina Ali Advance Practice Pharmacist, NHS Greater Glasgow & Clyde

Samina works as an advanced practice pharmacist in Glasgow South with a specialist interest in diabetes. She runs diabetes clinics in Glasgow South and at a practice in Ayrshire & Arran.

She is the chair of the Diabetes Specialist Interest Group for pharmacists. She is the primary care development lead on the UK Clinical Pharmacist Association diabetes and endocrinology group and is also on the Primary Care Diabetes Society committee. Pam presents at educational meetings and writes about diabetes, obesity and nutrition for primary care teams and the public. She is an Editorial Advisor for the Diabetes and Primary Care journal and edits Diabetes Distilled. He is a Diabetes UK Clinical Champion, a community consultant in Diabetes at the Manchester University foundation Trust and Chair of the Diabetes Board for Greater Manchester. He has a very keen focus on management of chronic conditions in the community and hence has been actively involved in setting up and running community-based clinics both in cardiology and diabetes. He is actively involved with the current integration agenda to provide patients with seamless care between primary and secondary sectors. He is also keen to ensure that the patients are seen at the right time, in the right place and by the right person. He is the Clinical Network Lead for Diabetes across Greater Manchester and East Cheshire. He has developed the diabetes strategy for Greater Manchester and actively involved in the development of pathways and strategies for long term conditions within the new ICS structure. Nicola moved to establish a Community Diabetes Education and Support Team within central Manchester which was a finalist in the Diabetes Quality in Care Awards in 2022.

As a co-author of the document Best Practice Diabetes Care within the Primary Care Network, Nicola is currently putting the evidence from this document into practice as the DiaST (Diabetes Support Lead) across a PCN in south Manchester.

Nicola is also the Diabetes Specialist Nurse Lead for the Greater Manchester and East Cheshire Strategic Clinical Network and was Chair of the Diabetes UK Professional Conference Organising Committee for Liverpool 2019, and member of the NICE Diabetes Guidelines suite 2019-2020.

Paul Newman GP, Glasgow

Paul Newman is a GP and trainer based at Waverley Park Medical Practice in Glasgow. He has a special interest in diabetes and was the Chair of the Professional Conference Organising Committee of Diabetes UK, London, in 2018. He is also the GP advisor to the Council of Healthcare Professionals of Diabetes UK as well as one of their Clinical Champions. He is Treasurer of the Primary Care Diabetes Society (PCDS) and has been the coorganiser and cochair of the PCDS Scottish annual conference since 2018. In 2006, Paul undertook a clinical sabbatical at the Toronto Western Hospital, Canada. Paul sits on the all-party parliamentary group for diabetes.

Paul is also active in diabetes research, particularly new medications for general practice. As a major contributor to Diabetes UK information prescriptions, Paul teamed up with the FFIT (Football Fans in Training) programme, and was responsible for training coaches to undertake random finger stick glucose measurements to screen for diabetes at football matches.





Chris Sainsbury Consultant Physician at Greater Glasgow & Clyde

Chris Sainsbury is a Consultant Physician / Diabetologist in NHS Greater Glasgow and Clyde, and has honorary academic positions at the University of Birmingham (Senior Research Fellow) and the University of Glasgow (Senior Clinical Lecturer). He is a CSO Innovation Fellow/NRS Senior Research Fellow, and is Clinical AI Lead at My Way Digitial Health. His research is focused on the application of machine learning methods to clinical data. Ongoing projects include: reinforcement learning in primary care data (CPRD) to predict optimum therapeutic choice; the use of generative machine learning methods to extract causal knowledge and generate synthetic data; using routinely collected data-driven approaches to identify individuals who would benefit from therapeutic intervention.



Naveed Sattar Professor of Metabolic Medicine

Naveed Sattar is expert in cardiometabolic disease, with epidemiology, mechanistic and trial expertise. He has contributed to several other randomised lifestyle trials (e.g. DIRECT, UPBEAT, EUROFIT) and multiple trials of pharmaceutical agents in diabetes and obesity. He has also helped on around 10 relevant national / international guidelines. He has authored/co-authored over 1300 published papers and been cited >230K (Google Scholar). He was recipient of the Banting Lecture by Diabetes UK in 2023 and previous recipient of the Camillo Golgi and Minkowski Award Lectures by EASD. He is an Associate Editor for Diabetes Care. In late 2023 he was appointed as the UK Government's new Obesity Mission Chair.
